Learn the basics of photography including the correct names and functions of various parts of the camera. Paper Making

This workshop will explore papermaking, starting with the acts of recycling and conservation. You will learn the simple paper making process using different kinds of paper scraps and organic material. Hand made paper is beautiful and can be used for note cards, special signage or creative decoration. The activity also shines a spotlight on the earth's limited resources, allowing you to help students think about the way they use those resources and ways they can conserve them.

You will leave the workshop with all the information you need to easily recreate the experience at your program.

Bead Making

Bead Making is a great way to nurture your student's individual expression while also teaching about African design and tribal cultures, geography, math, painting, modeling, and jewelry design. This workshop will cover all aspects of the craft including the following: creating beads with self-hardening clay; painting wood beads and clay beads previously made and dried; and jewelry-making including earrings, bracelets and necklaces. A ten-week course will be outlined and teachers will be able to adapt and use various parts of these lessons for their own needs. All materials will be provided including basic bead supplies, African worksheets, the complete 10 week syllabus, suggested African tribes for study, symbolism of colors, African beads coloring sheets, and examples of Kente Cloths.

Fun & Easy - Creating Projects in Modeling Clays

This A to Z, hands-on workshop will teach participants how to creatively and easily use two different modeling clays in their after school classroom for low cost.

Subjects covered include:

- ▶ **Modeling Clays** - what to buy, where to buy, buying in bulk, how much to buy, using, reusing, storing & drying.
- ▶ **Teaching Your Students** - sharing, choosing, using, conserving and clean-up of the modeling clays.
- ▶ **Freedom of creating!** Participants will learn “clay play” and “painting with clay” methods that are fun and creative. Projects are taught in a step-by-step process with accompanying hand-outs so projects can be reproduced. The Modeling Clays used will be a non-drying oil based and an air drying dough.
